SENATOR ROBINSON: I can't answer that for you. I can get the answer for you, Senator Coordsen, and I'll get it, move the bill along and I'll get that answer for you and then we can visit about it if that's okay.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Okay. Well, I appreciate that because it appeared that from the language of this bill that that would not be the case. The operator of the home would have to be a licensed funeral director/mortician but that really didn't appear to require that of the owner.

SENATOR ROBINSON: We have a member from the state group in the Rotunda so we'll check on that.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Okay. Thank you, appreciate it.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Anyone else would like to discuss LB 187? There's no other lights. Senator Robinson, Senator Robinson waives. All in favor of the advancement of LB 187 vote aye, opposed nay. Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of 187.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: LB 187 is advanced. LB 319.

CLERK: 319, Mr. President, introduced by Senator Wesely. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 13, referred to the Health and Human Services Committee. The bill was advanced to General File. I do have committee amendments pending by Health and Human Services, Mr. President.
