thought of in the fiscal note. But to make it clear that there is not going to be a problem, we put that amendment in that we just adopted that it won't be more than the cost of actually administering so...

SENATOR PIRSCH: Of the fees.

SENATOR WESELY: So the Lincoln Public Schools, yeah, are now in favor of the bill and have no problem with the bill.

SENATOR PIRSCH: What we're really getting at with this is so that across the State of Nebraska there is a consistent state building code to, I know, I think you and I were both in the body when a church...

SENATOR WESELY: Yes.

SENATOR PIRSCH: ...fell in because of inadequate design, so I appreciate your explanation. Thank you.

SENATOR WESELY: Thanks for your question.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Any other discussion on LB 319? I don't see any. Senator Wesely, would you want to close on LB 319.

SENATOR WESELY: Yes, I do want to clarify that the state building code that we have and continue and update with this bill is one that is not mandated. It is one that is optionally adopted by local subdivisions. They do have some flexibility in amending it, some flexibility in doing the grandfather clause that I talked about, but it does give us some consistency in protection of the public and I would move for advancement of 319.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Senator Wesely moves for the adoption of LB 319. All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of 319.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: LB 319 is advanced. LB 443.

CLERK: 443 was a bill introduced by Senator Wickersham. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 19, referred to the
