SPEAKER BAACK PRESIDING

SPEAKER BAACK: (Microphone not activated) ...Norris Legislative Chamber. For the prayer this morning we have Chaplain Harland Johnson.

HARLAND JOHNSON: (Prayer offered.)

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Harland. I now call to order the thirty-second day of the Ninety-Third Legislature, First Session. Roll call.

CLERK: I have a quorum present, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: Are there any corrections to the Journal?

CLERK: I have no corrections, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: Do you have items for the record?

CLERK: I do. Your Committee on Enrollment and Review respectfully reports they have carefully examined and reviewed LB 216 and recommend the same be placed on Select File; LB 218, LB 230, LB 270, LB 283, all on Select File, all signed by Senator Hohenstein as Chair. Business and Labor Committee reports LB 594 to General File with amendments. Signed by Senator Abboud. Government reports LB 407 to General File with amendments; LB 353...I'm sorry, 407 is by Government Committee, signed by Senator Schimek. Judiciary Committee reports LB 353 to General File, LB 693, General File; LB 379, General File with amendments; LB 490, General File with amendments; LB 642, General File with amendments; LB 12, indefinitely postponed; LB 457, indefinitely postponed; LB 466, indefinitely postponed. Those are signed by Senator Lindsay. Business and Labor reports LB 124 to General File; LB 608, General File; LB 525, General File with amendments; LB 403, indefinitely postponed. Those are signed by Senator Abboud. (See pages 755-59 of the Legislative Journal.)

In addition to those items, Mr. President, Government gives notice of public hearing. Judiciary gives notice of hearing. Senator Hohenstein has amendments to be printed to LB 579.
