LB 218

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Landis would move to amend. (Landis amendment, AM0561, appears on page 787 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. These amendments were suggested to us by the Bill Drafters Office. They're slightly more substantive than E & R amendments. They do two things. First, the bill drafter has reorganized the provisions of 218, and this amendment changes a number of internal references. You know how it will say subsection A, as above, or subsection B, or as referred to in Section 2, well you have to get those letters and those numbers right. Those are internal references, they're being changed in this. Secondly, the bill drafter suggests that we name this area of law the Seller Assisted Marketing Plan Act. Right now it's simply referred to as a series of sections of the bill. But in the event you make this change and you call this area of law the Seller Assisted Marketing Plan Act, it will be easier to make amendments in the future. So bill drafter asks us to make these two changes, correct some internal references and then name this general area of the statutes the Seller Assisted Marketing Plan Act for the ease of future amendments, should they be necessary. I would ask for the adoption of this bill drafters amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: Discussion on the amendment offered by Senator Landis? Seeing none, do you wish to close, Senator Landis? He waives closing. We will now vote on the amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Landis' amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: The amendment is adopted.

CLERK: I have nothing further, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Hohenstein.

SENATOR HOHENSTEIN: I move the advancement of LB 218 to E & R for engrossing.
