

have those children stuck in those situations without any really permanent arrangement for them in terms of a family. And, for that reason, I feel there is some sense of urgency to try and move this on now. There was no opposition from the committee, itself, as well as in terms of any testifiers and I would hope that you would consider returning to Select File LB 205 so we can amend this bill, and thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Rasmussen. We will now vote on the motion to return to Select File. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 32 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on adoption of the motion to return to Select File.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The motion is adopted. We are at Select File. Senator Rasmussen, would you like to offer your amendment now?

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: I would just ask the body to consider this amendment as I explained in the appeal to move it back so we could discuss it. I will be glad to entertain any questions, but other than that simply urge that you would adopt the amendment.
