

indeed, you may have citizens calling the mayor's hotline or some other law enforcement agency and saying, look, I know that this guy, he's lived next door to me for six months, he's lived next door to me for a year or more, he hasn't registered his plates and it's a point of aggravation to citizens who are obeying the law. And what 575 does with LB 434 in it is says, we will give an additional access to police officers to go after those people who have improperly registered their automobiles and we'll be able to collect the fees that are due the State of Nebraska. When we have a tight budget crisis, when we know this is going on and when we know we can correct it with a relatively simple piece of legislation, I think it's a mistake to allow what Senator Chambers wants to do and remove LB 434 from the bill and to allow the continuation of people to improperly register their vehicles not pay the fees that they're supposed to pay and allow them to get around the law. And so, for that, I would recommend that the body not accept Senator Chambers' amendment to the bill and would recommend that you advance the bill in its entirety. Thank you.
