

circumstances are clear and where you can prove, beyond a reasonable doubt, that, in fact, you have that kind of a violation. You're permitted to do it even though you have not caught the individual operating the vehicle. This is not the kind of change that...

PRESIDENT MOUL: One minute.

SENATOR HOHENSTEIN: ...is going to bring the forces of law enforcement down on people. They're going to have, frankly, more work to do in these cases but it's the kind of work that they can do by keeping track of vehicles that are parked in front of homes for 30 days. We still have to prove in a court of law beyond a reasonable doubt that, in fact, the situs is in Nebraska. That's not an easy proposition. So I don't see that the Horgan bill, which is now merged in part of the committee amendments, is a problem and I think that the issue really is directed specifically to enforcement. This, in fact, makes it more logical because these should not really be moving violations. They should be licensing and registration violations. So I would oppose the amendment to the amendment. I think that, hopefully, that clarifies the situation and I'm willing and able to respond to any questions anybody has about it.
