SENATOR CROSBY:    LB 387 advances.    Before we proceed to the next bill, the State Patrol has asked me to announce that Interstate 80 opened at 9:30 a.m.    between Lincoln and Omaha. Now we'll go to LB 517.    Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK:    LB 517 was introduced by Senator Wesely. (Read title.)    The bill was read for the first time on January 19.    It was referred to the Health and Human Services Committee.    That committee reports the bill to General File with no amendments.

SENATOR CROSBY:    Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY:    Thank you, Madam President, and members, LB 517 is a follow up to a bill I passed about 10 years ago.    It's uniform billing.    UB82 was the bill that we had a few years ago that allowed for a uniform bill to be used by people as they were billing in health care.    That UB82 has been updated to UB92 and so all this bill does is update that form.    It does nothing more than that and I would ask for advancement of the bill.

SENATOR CROSBY:    Thank you, Senator Wesely.    Any discussion on LB 517?    Seeing none, Senator Wesely.    Senator Wesely waives closing.    We will proceed with the vote on LB 517.    Those in favor vote aye, opposed no.    Record, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK:    25 ayes, 0 nays on the advancement of the bill.

SENATOR CROSBY:    LB 517 advances.    LB 817.

ASSISTANT CLERK:    LB 817 was introduced by Senators Wesely and Byars. (Read title.)    The bill was read for the first time on January 21st, referred to the Health and Human Services Committee.    They report the bill to General File with no amendments, however, I do have an amendment from Senator Wesely.

SENATOR CROSBY:    Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY:    Yes, thank you, Madam President, and members, I will go over the bill briefly and then talk about the amendment which clarifies the bill.    LB 817 is actually a very important bill and will have, I think, a very positive impact on the State
