CLERK: LB 453A, introduced by Senator Withem. (Read title.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Withem.

SENATOR WITHEM: Madam President and members of the body, LB 453 is a bill that establishes a group of Nebraska citizens to formulate a telecommunication strategy. The bill was advanced from General File to Select File. The appropriations bill provides appropriations of \$25,000 for '93-94 and \$25,000 for '94-95 to carry out these purposes. I was asked questions on General File as to whether there is a per diem for expenses for people that serve on this board that's established; there are not. This \$25,000 is for internal expenses within the Department of Administrative Services. With that, if there are any questions, I would respond. Otherwise, as Senator McKenzie so eloquently stated, this bill needs to catch up with its other bill and would urge you to support it.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Withem. Does anyone wish to speak to this bill? Seeing none, we will now vote on the motion to advance LB 453A. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the advancement of 453A.

PRESIDENT MOUL: LB 453A is advanced. We'll now proceed to Select File, LB 588.

CLERK: Madam President, 588, Senator Hohenstein, I have Enrollment and Review amendments pending, Senator.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Hohenstein.

SENATOR HOHENSTEIN: I would move the adoption of the E & R amendments to LB 588.

PRESIDENT MOUL: You've heard the motion to adopt the E & R amendments. All those in favor please say aye. Opposed nay. E & R amendments are adopted.

CLERK: Madam President, Senator Baack would move to amend with an amendment found on page 1099 of the Journal.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Speaker Baack.
