

compromise here on the issue of checks and balances on the environmental issues which are of concern to many...all of us, I'm sure, in the body. And so I again welcome Senator Avery's amendment and appreciate that...him bringing it. And if the amendment passes I can certainly support the bill. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Ashford. Senator Baack.

SPEAKER BAACK: Yes, Madam President and colleagues, I rise in support of the amendment also. And I think it's in the proper order now where we do allow the department to be the rule and regulation setting agency, but we do now put the...the advisory committee that Senator Avery was talking about, we insert that into the bill in the rules and regulation section. So I think we're in the proper order here, and I think it does...it does provide some more reenforcement to the idea that we are asking for cooperation between these various departments as we implement this program and as we start looking at our comprehensive water management plan, we are asking for cooperation between the departments. We expect them to use each others expertise in developing these plans for the future. So I think it's a good amendment and it does spell it out just a little more clearly that we want their input as we set up rules and regulations dealing with FIFRA. Thank you.
