

They are adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Pedersen has an amendment. (The Pedersen amendment, AM0855, appears on page 1258 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Pedersen.

SENATOR PEDERSEN: Mr. Chairman, members of the body, this simply changes the language in the bill to state that all motor vehicle fatalities must be reported to the State Department of Roads rather than the Department of Motor Vehicles. The accident records bill has been housed at the Department of Roads for many years and all accident reports have been sent there. This amendment just clarifies the current practice in statute.

SPEAKER BAACK: Discussion of the amendment by Senator Pedersen. Senator Wehrbein, did you wish to discuss the amendment? Senator Pedersen, do you wish to close on your amendment? Waives closing. We will now vote on the amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Pedersen's amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: The amendment is adopted.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Hohenstein.

SENATOR HOHENSTEIN: I move the advancement of LB 590 to E & R for engrossing.

SPEAKER BAACK: You've heard the motion to advance LB 590. All those in favor say aye. Opposed no. It is advanced. LB 23.

CLERK: LB 23, I have no amendments to the bill, Senator.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Hohenstein.
