CLERK: LB 90, Senator, I have no amendments to the bill.

SENATOR HOHENSTEIN: Move the advancement of LB 90 to E & R for engrossing.

PRESIDENT MOUL: You've heard the motion to advance LB 90. All those in favor please say aye. Opposed nay. LB 90 is advanced. That completes Select File. Items for the record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Madam President, Enrollment and Review reports LB 299 correctly engrossed; LB 346 as correctly engrossed. (See pages 1310-11 of the Legislative Journal.)

Bills read on Final Reading were presented to the Governor as of 2:05. (Re: LB 370, LB 579, LB 579A.)

Senator Landis has amendments to LB 216; Senator Schellpeper to LB 563; Senator Hall to LB 124. That's all that I have, Madam President. (See pages 1313-15 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. We'll now return to General File and LB 235 is next.

CLERK: Madam President, 235 was a bill introduced by Senator Baack. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 11, referred to the Natural Resources Committee for public hearing, advanced to General File. I do have committee amendments pending by the Natural Resources Committee.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Madam President and members of the Legislature, the committee amendments are purely technical in nature. Switches over an old system for defining penalties to our new system for definite penalties and adjusts some definitions. That's really all the committee amendments do. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Chambers. Does anyone wish to address the committee amendments? Seeing none, we'll now vote on the committee amendments to LB 235. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.
