

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, this is a bill which carries the emergency clause and there is funding involved, but if the bill took effect immediately upon passage and signing by the Governor, there would be a gap between the time the bill passed and the beginning of the fiscal year which is July 1. So the purpose of returning the bill is to put an operative date of July 1st so that then when the bill actually goes into effect there will be money to carry out the requirements. There will be money transferred from the Department of Corrections to the Parole Board, and I'll discuss that on 677A. So I'm asking that it be returned for that specific amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: Discussion on the motion to return? Seeing none, do you wish to close, Senator Chambers? We will now vote on the motion to return. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to return.

SPEAKER BAACK: The bill is returned. We'll go to Senator Chambers for the amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, the amendment is as I discussed it. The amendment would put an operative date on this bill of January 1st, 1993 and I ask that it be adopted.

SPEAKER BAACK: Any discussion on the amendment by Senator Chambers? Seeing none, we will vote on the amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: The amendment is adopted. Senator Chambers, would you like to move to readvance the bill.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, I move that LB 677 be readvanced.

SPEAKER BAACK: You've heard the motion to advance LB 677. All those in favor say aye. Opposed no. It is advanced. Go to LB 677A.
