Ashford a question, if I may. Senator Ashford, has the amendment been worked out yet that you all were working on?

SENATOR ASHFORD: Yes, Senator Chambers, it has.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Before we proceed, I would like to call the senators' attention to the area under the north balcony. Special guests today of Senator Schellpeper are Marge Dietz, Sharon O'Brien, and Tiffany Weyh, all of Madison, Wisconsin. Would you please rise and be recognized. Welcome to the Chamber and welcome to Nebraska. Thank you. Mr. Clerk, do you have an amendment?

CLERK: Madam President, Senator Ashford would move to amend Senator Abboud's amendment. I have AM1143 in front of me, Senator. (Printed separately from the Journal.)

SENATOR ASHFORD: Thank you, and I apologize, Mr. Clerk, for the confusion on 1143. It was my understanding that Senator Abboud's amendment actually did have the community corrections piece in it but it didn't, and that was just inadvertent. But what this amendment to the amendment does is take the community corrections concept and puts it into LB 627, and then we can move the whole thing over to Select File, and talk about boot camps and community corrections as one piece. So with that, I'd just move the amendment to the amendment. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Ashford. Senator Warner, you wish to speak to this amendment. Senator Abboud.

SENATOR ABBOD: I support the amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Abboud. Senator Lindsay. Senator Ashford.

SENATOR ASHFORD: (Mike off) the amendment to the amendment. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam Chair, I also support the amendment, and after the amendment has been adopted, then they can move the bill, lock, stock and outhouse, to Select File. I still will
