PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Moore. Does anyone else wish to address the bill? Seeing none, you've all heard the motion to advance LB 831 to E & R. All those in favor please say aye. Opposed nay. LB 831 is advanced. Items for the record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Just one, Madam President. Communication from the Governor to the Clerk. (Read communication re. LB 299, LB 23, LB 191, LB 201, LB 305, LB 305A, LB 526, LB 590, LB 726 and LB 818 as found on page 1480 of the Legislative Journal.) That's all that I have, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. We'll then proceed with Item 7, General File, LB 110.

CLERK: Madam President, LB 110 is on General File and has been discussed by the Legislature on three separate occasions. Committee amendments have been offered. An amendment by Senators Lindsay, Landis and Bohlke was adopted to the committee amendments. An amendment by Senator Chambers to the committee amendments was adopted. Senator Chambers offered an amendment, on page 5, strike lines 1 through 5. That amendment was defeated. Senator Chambers then moved to reconsider the vote on that amendment. That is the motion now pending, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President and members of the Legislature, the amendment, as mentioned by the Clerk, is found on page 5 of the amendment numbered 1309, which was adopted as an amendment to the committee amendments, and this amendment number 1309 now is the bill. The reconsideration motion is designed to deal with lines 1 through 5 on page 5, which talk about information that a physician is required to give to a patient. That information relates to medical assistance benefits which may be available for prenatal care, childbirth and neonatal care, and also what I consider legal advice relative to the liability of the purported father to assist in the support of the child. I had asked Senator Lindsay, with reference to the second part of this provision, if included in the information he would want the physician to give to the woman information about what it takes to establish paternity and he said he did not want to give that information.
