

I'm concerned about...

SENATOR CUDABACK: I guess that will be up to the board. That will be up to the board to state when...

SENATOR VRTISKA: I...I tend to agree with what you're saying. I was just trying to clarify as when that person would be able to go back and I guess you basically said there are certain times when that's done and so that really answers my question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: If he pays his fees, if he wants to do it every week if it's available, I guess so be it, as long as he learns from his past mistakes and he's...

SENATOR VRTISKA: All right, thank you.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Vrtiska. Senator Robinson.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Mr. Speaker, members of the body, just wanted to clarify a couple things. I talked to the head of the State Electrical Board back here and he said if you're hired by an electrician, you're an apprentice. There are no qualifications throughout the state for being apprentice. If you're hired by a journeyman, you are an electrician. And on the question Senator Vrtiska just asked, you can take...retake that test, it's held once a month, you can take it. So you could take it once a month for five months till you pass it.
