floor, I don't think anybody out there in the lobby, I don't think anybody out there in the State of Nebraska would start from the assumption that the choice or the decision that a woman has to make is an easy one to arrive at. I think we all understand that the decision, itself, is very difficult, that circumstances can make that decision a very hard decision to arrive at, and that I don't believe the majority of women make the decision lightly. What the bill seeks to do is to make the information that would help make a decision that they are comfortable with readily available to them, to make sure that if there are things that they haven't considered but would want to consider, that they don't have to search in libraries or search in medical books, that that information if readily available to them. The intent, and there have been some amendments offered that have tried to make sure that the information is objective or as objective as possible, and that is the intent. This is not all the horror pictures or the parade of horrors that you hear about is not the intent of this bill. This bill is about a woman's right to know, and that a right to know should precede the decision that certainly she can question but she can never reverse. I urge that LB 110 be advanced to Select File.
