

and define proprietary functions. Why? Because proprietary functions fall outside the budget limitations. These are operations that the city runs as a business. And, in that sense, you need a definition for what they are, so this says a proprietary function means a water supply, distribution utility, a waste water collection and treatment utility, an electric generation transmission and distribution utility, a gas supply, an integrated solid waste management collection utility, or a hospital or nursing home owned by a municipality, that's a proprietary function. Anyway, that is for the purpose of making a definition which otherwise appears in the bill. I would urge the adoption of the amendment to the committee amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Landis. Discussion. Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Yeah, Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I just briefly rise to support these amendments. We did discuss, I believe, discussed these in committee, and it was a clarification of the committee amendments. As Senator Landis has indicated, it does...did avoid a double accounting situation in one instance, which needed to be corrected. Obviously, those proprietary organ...activities should also not be included. So I would hope the body would adopt the amendments to the committee amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Warner. Any other discussion of the amendment by Senator Landis? Seeing none, do you wish to close, Senator Landis? He waives closing.
