PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. We will now proceed with General File, LB 235.

CLERK: Madam President, LB 235 was introduced by Senator Baack. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 11 of this year, at that time was referred to the Natural Resources Committee. The bill was advanced to General File. I do have committee amendments pending by Natural Resources.
