

the IME concept which is why you don't do all of Section 13, but the lines 10 through 12 do refer to a housekeeping. It was the concept I just described and that is that risk management pools may be considered self-insurers. And then subsection (6), which are lines 13 through 15 relate to the benefits concept. Lastly, you pick up again on housekeeping measures, internal references this time. On the following page, on line 17 or subsection (7).

SENATOR HALL: And where does that run and finish, Senator Landis?

SENATOR LANDIS: To the end.

SENATOR HALL: It runs...

SENATOR LANDIS: Excuse me, no, it doesn't go to the end because you've got the safety committee concept that we've broken out and that picks up at line 5 through 18, then back to housekeeping for the end of the section.

SENATOR HALL: Okay, so just so I understand this then the entirety of page 1281 of the Journal...

SPEAKER BAACK: One minute.

SENATOR HALL: ...first page would be the IME.

SENATOR LANDIS: IME.

SENATOR HALL: The top of 1282 through line 14, first half, would be IME.

SENATOR LANDIS: Would be IME, right.

SENATOR HALL: Then we would be from lines 15 through the end of that page would be housekeeping.

SENATOR LANDIS: Yes.

SENATOR HALL: And then the top of page 1283, lines 12 through 27...

SENATOR LANDIS: Housekeeping again, right.

SENATOR HALL: Then lines 1 through 6 would be IME.
