

SENATOR MOORE: I mean, is the state going to pay the postage (inaudible) firearm (inaudible)?

SENATOR ASHFORD: The idea would be that the National Rifle Association would pay for the postage, and that was what was originally discussed with Senator Schellpeper. And he made that commitment, I just never got that from the NRA. And I now have that, so that's fine...from him.

SENATOR MOORE: I guess...I mean, I don't have so much of a problem with the bill itself, but I guess our discussion hasn't got me to a comfort level that there doesn't need to be an A bill of some sort. We can talk about that maybe later.

SENATOR ASHFORD: Okay.

SENATOR MOORE: But I have some concerns with the (inaudible) amendment that I believe, the way I read it, should increase some...it's implementing a new program and a new duty for the Department of Health. There's logically some costs there. And there should be a corresponding cost reflected in an A bill,...

PRESIDENT MOUL: One minute.

SENATOR ASHFORD: I appreciate that, Senator Moore.

SENATOR MOORE: ...is...is...it's my thought. I don't have a big problem with what you're doing. I just want to make sure that we account for it properly.

SENATOR ASHFORD: And that's...

SENATOR MOORE: And that's...and my concern is that just to read that it sounds like, well, we're going to get private funds to pay for it so we don't need any General Fund money. And I...

SENATOR ASHFORD: I think we will have some General Fund money that would be very...less than \$5,000. And there's a...but I can...I think if we...if we could just...if we would adopt this and then...and then we can discuss the...the A bill portion of it, Senator Moore, I think I can satisfy you.

SENATOR MOORE: Does this bill have an...Senator Lindsay is not here.
