SENATOR WEHRBEIN: And as part of 262?

SENATOR ABOUD: Yes.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: This year?

SENATOR ABOUD: Yeah, you can talk to the Chairman of the Committee, Senator Lindsay is over there if you would like to talk to him about it.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I have no reason to doubt you but I didn't know that that was part of it. I rise to oppose this bill at this point. I...there hasn't been a good case to me yet made to why we should extend the statute of limitations simply going from two to four, and as I...if this had the public hearing that it was stated then there was a mountain of opposition to it, as I read in the bill book, so it appears that that, in itself, is a good reason at this point to oppose passage of this bill.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, a priority motion. Senator Abboud,...I assume, Senator, you would ask unanimous consent to bracket the bill until May 14, 1993.

SENATOR ABOUD: Yeah.

SPEAKER BAACK: Any objection? If no objection, the bill is bracketed. Items for the record, Mr. Clerk.
