

particular provisions relative to breast implants and surgical devices, that we leave that part of it alone. That's a similar exception pulled out like asbestos was a number of years ago and that you withdraw your amendment and then relook at that exact language in the Kansas act so that we have a specific standard if that is your intention. I have worked with farm chemicals myself and I agree that that may be something that we ought to look at but that perhaps you relook at the Kansas act and the particular language because I think if you have the language of your amendment without some sort of legitimate legal standard, like reasonable, prudent person, you're not going to get what you want and that you will have time to...if you want to do it on General File (sic), you'll have time to look at that yet. We've got a couple other amendments up and maybe rework that. And I just suggest that that might be an appropriate way to address that issue because I still feel some concerns about your amendment because I don't think that it's clear enough as to what you're trying to do, although I think your intention is very clear on the floor and I agree with that intention. Would you consider doing that?

SENATOR BROMM: Yes. And I think Senator Crosby would be more comfortable with that, and visiting with Senator Chambers, I think between now and then we can work on the language. The idea...I'm interested in the idea but I want to make sure that it's drafted properly so I would be willing to do that, Madam President.

SENATOR HOHENSTEIN: Thank you.

SENATOR BROMM: Withdraw this amendment and move on to the rest of the bill.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The amendment is withdrawn. Do senators want to speak now to the Will amendment? Senator Crosby.

SENATOR CROSBY: I will waive off. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Beutler. Does anyone else wish to speak to the Will amendment? Seeing none, do you have closing, Senator Will?
