I think that takes...I think that does take care of the...of the implant situation but I feel better leaving that language in there so that we know we've got it covered, Senator Crosby, and adding this language to cover those things that we don't know might be harmful and we discover later, as we did in the breast implant situation here, that it was harmful for us. And this language is...applies the reasonably prudent man standard which I think Senator Hohenstein was concerned about and I believe would be worthwhile inserting. I would like to try to insert this and, again, I'm willing to work on it, study it, try to improve it before we get to Select File, but I think it's worth getting into the bill at this time.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Bromm. Senator Abboud, you're next.

SENATOR ABOUD: Madam President, colleagues, I support the amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL: Thank you, Madam President, members of the body, I, too, support the Bromm amendment. I think this more properly addresses the problem that he was addressing before. I would hope that we would adopt this amendment and advance the bill.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Will. Senator Kristensen.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: When the old train is rolling down the track, you can do two things. You can stand in front of the train and let it run you over, or you can wave at it as it goes by, I guess. We didn't vote to adjourn. This is a fairly substantive amendment and I think the body needs to understand that because it's 12:09, you can vote with it and say, well, we'll fix it later, but there's a lot of things that this brings in and includes and I just want to make sure...Senator Bromm, if I could just get into the record a little bit because I really think you need to be cautious about drawing these amendments on the floor when they broaden out a bill that's going to cover them. And maybe that doesn't offend you or bother you but I've got to tell you you may be opening up a Pandora's Box. Senator Bromm, does this include things like insecticides, fertilizers and chemicals as well?

SENATOR BRMM: Yes, Senator, I believe that it could.
