

SPEAKER BAACK: It is withdrawn.

CLERK: Senator Ashford, you want to withdraw. Senator Beutler would move to amend. (See FA174 on page 1983 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, I think this could be very quick. We made a decision about adult day care transportation services. The effect of the Moore amendment was to wipe out what we did previous to that, on the previous Beutler amendment. All this amendment does is to restore that in accordance with the decision we made a few minutes ago.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: I oppose that amendment. We made a decision that cut those services. Let's go ahead and see what people want to do, so I think we ought to just go ahead. I oppose the Beutler amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: Any discussion? Any further discussion? Senator Beutler, do you wish to close?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Well, Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, I understand that Senator Wesely feels poorly about the outcome of the larger amendment, but, nonetheless, I think that the probabilities and the balances that we weighed and discussed on the amendment before still pertain, and I see no reason why now fifteen minutes later you wouldn't want to retain the same decision or make the same decision you made fifteen minutes earlier. It is not a big matter. You've made a big cut now. A hundred thousand dollars on this particular amendment I think would be...I think would be well spent for the reasons that we all discussed earlier. I hope you will restore it. Thank you.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. You have heard the closing on the Beutler amendment. We will now vote on the amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. We are voting on the Beutler amendment to the committee amendments. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.
