SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Moore. We will now vote on the advancement of 327. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of 327.

SPEAKER BAACK: LB 327 advances. We'll go to LB 328.

CLERK: LB 328, a bill introduced by the Speaker at the request of the Governor. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 13, referred directly to General F...referred to the committee, advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Moore, to open on LB 328.

SENATOR MOORE: Mr. Speaker, we probably all have a conflict of interest on LB 328. This is our salary bill. But I guess since we get no salary raise, there's probably no reason we need to file a conflict on it. LB 328 simply appropriates \$632,982 in General Funds to pay our salaries. We get no raise whatsoever, and that amount stays constant in the second year of the biennium. With that, I'd ask for advancement of the bill.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Moore. Any discussion on LB 328? Seeing none, we will vote on the advancement of LB 328. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of 328.

SPEAKER BAACK: LB 328 advances. We'll go to LB 329.

CLERK: LB 329, introduced by the Speaker at the request of the Governor. (Read title.) Introduced on January 13. The bill was referred to the Appropriations Committee, advanced to General File. I have committee amendments pending.
