SPEAKER BAACK PRESIDING

SPEAKER BAACK: Good afternoon and welcome to the George W. Norris Legislative Chamber. Roll call. Record, Mr. Clerk.

And this simply is what the auditor said it would...additional funds it would take to look into the proprietary budgets, beings there would be many more budgets filed at a different time, he would need additional personnel, one-half to be exact. How you get one-half I'm not for sure. But anyway, take one-half person to look into these additional funds and additional budgets being audited. I ask for your support for this A bill. Thank you.
