LB 697, 739

SPEAKER BAACK: LB 739 advances. The call is raised. We'll now go to LB 697.

CLERK: LB 697, Mr. President, E & R amendments are pending, first of all.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Hohenstein.

SENATOR HOHENSTEIN: I move the adoption of the E & R amendments to LB 697.

SPEAKER BAACK: You've heard the motion to adopt the E & R amendments to LB 697. All those in favor say aye. Opposed no. They are adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, the first amendment is by Senator Schimek. Senator, AM1708.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, Mr. President, members of the body. I'd like to substitute...I'd like to withdraw that and substitute AM1959.

SPEAKER BAACK: Any objection? No objection, so ordered.

CLERK: Senator, I have AM1959 in front of me. (See page 2046 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: And...oh, you're putting up the new page number now, it's on page 2046. This is a simple amendment that, if you'll recall, this bill has to do with some of the collective bargaining agreements. And what this amendment does is it removes all sections that make changes to the 40 hour work provisions that are in current law. So it's been kind of a back and forth thing again as far as the actual wording here. But I think this one will be the last change on that 40 hour work week provision. So, with that, I would simply ask for its approval.

SPEAKER BAACK: Discussion on the amendment by Senator Schimek? Seeing none, we'll now vote on the amendment. All those in
