And in my judgment, if that particular group is saying that this is good policy, this is what would make sense, not only for their enforcement side, for good campaign law, and dynamics for the campaign law that we have before us, 587, then that's something I'm willing to do. So, consequently, I oppose the amendment 2127, at this point. Thank you.
