

SENATOR HABERMAN: Thank you, Senator McKenzie.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Haberman. Senator Hillman.

SENATOR HILLMAN: Mr. Speaker, members, Senator McKenzie, would you yield to a question, please.

SENATOR MCKENZIE: Senator Hillman, the language in the bill states that they may develop a statewide environmental awareness action plan. Our intent is to ask for their cooperation and collaboration in the study this summer.

SENATOR HILLMAN: Okay, now is that going to require any General Funds?

SENATOR MCKENZIE: No.

SENATOR HILLMAN: They are going to do that in-house.

SENATOR MCKENZIE: Yes.

SENATOR HILLMAN: And using their present personnel?

SENATOR MCKENZIE: Yes.

SENATOR HILLMAN: If, through the interim study, then if they would define and the testing, I am assuming between the interim study and the testing, will it be a combination of the two?

SENATOR MCKENZIE: It is my understanding that it will be.

SENATOR HILLMAN: Then they would come back to the Legislature for any appropriation that they would want to do then to
