

under the conditions of 270. That's the purpose of the amendment, Mr. President. And if I could take up the amendment to it first, if it's there.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Warner. Mr. Clerk, amendment on the desk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Madam President, Senator Warner would move to amend his amendment. (Warner amendment, AM2079, may be found on page 2320 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Is that to strike may and insert shall? If you look on page 1799 of the Journal, on line 18 is the word may. The question was raised whether that was...made it possible for the Legislature, a future Legislature not to make the reimbursement. I don't think it reads that way, to start with. But by putting in the word shall, it relieves any doubt about it, so I'd move adoption of that amendment, and then we can vote on the amendment itself.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Warner. I'll recognize senators wishing to speak to the amendment to the amendment. Senator Moore.

SENATOR MOORE: The amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Lindsay.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Thank you, Madam President. Senator Warner, if I could just ask you a question on that. What line are you on, on page 1799, where you're changing the language?

SENATOR WARNER: I believe it's line 18. I don't have it here in front of me.

SENATOR LINDSAY: The second line 18 at the bottom of the page?

SENATOR WARNER: Excuse me, the one at the bottom of the page, second line. That was brought to my attention. It was less concern if that was shall.
