SENATOR HILLMAN: Are you looking at still offering your amendment to take an addi...

SENATOR MOORE: No.

SENATOR HILLMAN: Okay.

SENATOR MOORE: But pulling my amendment now, but offering the same amendment to LB 190A and if I did that, would you be supportive of doing that because...

SENATOR HILLMAN: Yes.

SENATOR MOORE: Okay, I will withdraw this amendment at this point in time.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Moore. The amendment is withdrawn. Next amendment, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Madam President, the next amendment I have to the bill is by Senator Wesely. Senator, I have AM2398 (sic). (Wesely
