

response from the agencies involved in preparation of the fiscal notes on LB 190, those agencies said...did not request any General Funds.

SENATOR WESELY: So they never asked for it in the first place?

SENATOR MOORE: They never asked for it. Now I'm of the opinion there's a cost involved there of \$50,000 but it's stated in their fiscal notes that they willing to absorb that cost, as I have...as many of you have been victimized by me, I've always been somewhat of a stickler that an A bill ought to reflect the cost of a new program. I think the cost is \$50,000, an additional something to DED. DED and the others involved said they are willing to absorb that cost. And so it would take away the General Fund impact of the bill.

SENATOR WESELY: And this is something agreed to at this point in time with the various entities involved, or...

SENATOR MOORE: Senator Hillman and I had a dialogue on LB 330 last week. I mean, I would argue I'm giving them what they asked for, because they never wanted a General Fund A bill. I guess, I...I was the one that was somewhat adamant that that be on there and, I mean, I'm not going to speak for the administration or the introducer of the bill, it would be better to...

SENATOR WESELY: Of course, sometimes what people ask for isn't what they want, so...(laughter).

SENATOR MOORE: You can interpret whatever way you wish, but I've learned that more than once in my life.

SENATOR WESELY: Okay. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Wesely. Does anyone wish to speak to the motion? Seeing none, do you have closing, Senator Moore?

SENATOR MOORE: I...I'm hesitant to answer Senator Wesely, but I believe (inaudible) he's talking that that is what they want and so, but if I'm incorrect, maybe we can ask the presiding officer, but...(laughter). And so with that, I would ask for adoption of the amendment.
