I don't know what that 7 million was going to buy for the university. I know my taxes went up 10 percent at Metro Tech. I know, it's sort of a runaway freight train. I had an amendment up there to cut it in half, along with the university, but you know we couldn't do that. We couldn't debate those things. We couldn't debate those things, but we should. And I don't think we're responsible when we don't. I respectfully withdraw my amendment. Thank you.
