SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Senator Chambers. I'll defer to the Speaker on that issue. Senator Withem, if you would comment on...

SPEAKER WITHEM: Yes, Senator Hall, I would...my sense is that we've moved through the rules debate much quicker than I expected. This is, I believe, a fairly complex rule change as are the next two. So my personal preference would be that we move to adjourn.
