SPEAKER WITHEM PRESIDING

SPEAKER WITHEM: Welcome to the George W. Norris Legislative Chamber. Our prayer this morning will be given by Chaplain Coordinator, Harland Johnson.

HARLAND JOHNSON: (Prayer offered.)

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Harland. We will proceed with the roll call. Members, please record your presence.

PRESIDENT ROBAK PRESIDING

CLERK: Have a quorum present, Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you. Are there any corrections to the Journal?

CLERK: I have no corrections, Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Any messages, reports, or announcements.

CLERK: Just a simple item, that LR 290, LR 291, LR 292, and LR 294 are ready for your signature, Madam President. That is all that I have.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you. While the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business, I propose to sign and do sign, LR 290, LR 291, LR 292, and LR 294. We will proceed to General File, Mr. Speaker.

CLERK: Madam President, LB 693, a bill originally introduced by Senator Crosby. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 21 of last year. At that time it was referred to the Judiciary Committee. The bill was advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill at this time, Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Senator Crosby, would you like to open?

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Madam President and members. I brought this bill a year ago, and LB 693 is a follow-up to legislation that Senator Lindsay brought to us a little over a year ago, which entitled victims of sexual assault to request that the convicted person be tested for AIDS.
