SENATOR PREISTER: Thank you, Honorable President, friends all, I'm not sure if there is a relevancy rule, I just rise to say that in styrofoam where else can you buy something for a penny that will last 500 years? I certainly don't support the use of styrofoam and there are other sanitary uses, such as cups, that could be used rather than styrofoam and just would like to state that for the record. Thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Preister. Senator Crosby, would you care to close?

SENATOR CROSBY: No close, thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Crosby. The issue before the body is the motion to withdraw LR 280CA. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay. Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the motion to withdraw LR 280CA.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: LR 280CA is withdrawn. New bills, Mr. Clerk.
