

have a little more luck than he had when carrying my legislation. But anyway, since I can't get a bill on consent calendar, I'm happy to substitute for Senator Will. The provision in LB 416 merely would allow that an individual who doesn't have a shipping license, and a shipping license is required by the Liquor Control Commission in order to ship wine or liquor into the state to a wholesaler. What 416 does, it just carves out a little exemption for some small wineries, some wineries, hopefully, locally based. I know that there are some in the northwest section of the state. Also individuals who are outside the state who are trying to sell product in Nebraska but don't want to purchase a shipping license and want to see if the product they have is something that can be sold. They want to ship it to the wholesaler, have them give or sell the product to some of their clientele to see if there is a demand for it. At that point in time they would then be able to apply for a shipping license if they thought that there was a market which they could tap in Nebraska. It limits it to three gallons in any one year. So you're only looking at a three gallon limitation for purposes of exempting them from the shipping license. I would urge that the body advance LB 416 to E & R Initial. Thank you, Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Hall. Senator Hall, do you wish to close? The issue before the body is the advancement of LB 416. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the advancement of LB 416.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: LB 416 advances to E & R Initial. LB 1019.

CLERK: LB 1019, Madam President, introduced by Senator Wehrbein. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 10 of this year, referred to the Urban Affairs Committee, advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Chair recognizes Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Madam President, members of the body, this bill, once again, deals with the commission form of government, of which, in this case Nebraska, it is Nebraska City. That is the reason for the bill. It has to do with appointment of a Board of Health. And if you look at, in the bill it simply adds
