Cudaback originally. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 13 of last year, referred to the Health Committee, advanced to General File. I do have committee amendments pending.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Chair recognizes Senator Cudaback.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Madam President, members of the body, LB 338 was brought to me by a group of concerned practitioners in this field. We think that...it was held in Health and Human Services and we discussed it with the Health Department. We discussed it with Senator Wesely. We discussed with his staff. We had many of the problems worked out on this bill. We have some concerns on the floor this morning with a consent calendar type issue. Senator Chambers has many questions. Senator Chambers has said that he would probably...would not be able to get all these answers...his questions answered in the 15 minutes, and so, for the sake of time and for the sake of the body's time and not wasting the precious moments we have here on this 60-day session, I think at this time it does put me in a very, very hairy situation here, but I think at this time I would ask the body for the consent just to pass over this LB 338.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The request is that we pass over LB 338. It is so ordered. We will pass (microphone inactivated). LB 338A. We'll pass over LB 338A as well. LB 188.

CLERK: LB 188, Madam President, a bill introduced by Senator Lindsay. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 8, referred to the Judiciary Committee. The bill was advanced to General File. I do have committee amendments pending by the Judiciary Committee.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Chair wishes the body to know that we will finish the consent calendar yet this morning. So if you are planning to attend...to go to lunch, I want to let you know that we will...we plan to get through the consent calendar. The Chair recognizes Senator Lindsay to open on the committee amendments.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Thank you, Madam President, and members, LB 188 was a bill dealing with real estate conveyances. It deals with political or with plating of subdivision. Part of the problem is that if a subdivision is improperly plated, in the future it could pose a problem with the title to the real
