SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Mr. President. Ladies and gentlemen, that's what we're dealing with. We're dealing with the green copy and to respond to Senator Witek, as much as I hate to with regard to how often don't we put committee amendments on a bill, never on bills that are pulled from committee that I can remember in 10 years, never, because these motions come up rarely. You're dealing with the subject matter that did not get the confirmation of the committee, period, even in its amended form, and I did not vote for any amendments to this proposal, nor would I vote for this proposal in the amendment as it sits in the Journal. I would have a question for Senator Pirsch with regard to the specific subject matter if she would respond.

SENATOR HALL: Senator Pirsch, tell me, on page 3 of the green copy, since that is what we're dealing with and that's what the motion relates to, what does on line 2 through line 3, or the first portion of line 3, what does the rights to prompt restitution from the convicted offender mean?
