PRESIDENT ROBAK: LR 2CA advances to E & R Initial. LB 254.

CLERK: LB 254, Madam President, is on Select File, has been discussed as late as January 25 of this year. Enrollment and Review amendments as well as an amendment by Senator McKenzie and Kristensen was adopted. When the Legislature left the issue on the 25th Senator Chambers had an amendment pending. Senator, it's your amendment that reads in AM2284, which were amendments adopted by Senator Kristensen on General File, in the second line 8 strike "or a traffic infraction".

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Chair recognizes Senator Kristensen. If you would just briefly refresh the body of where we are and then I will turn the issue over to Senator Chambers.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Well, Senator Chambers was just about to withdraw all of his amendments and allow the bill to be advanced onto Final Reading if I remember correctly. Well, maybe not. LB 254, just to refresh your recollections, this is the bill that deals with geographic jurisdiction of the allowing of police officer, the issues have become the ability to go across jurisdictional lines, for example, a police officer into the county and then the ability to go to the next adjacent county line and we are discussing amendments about which sorts of offenses that ought to take place on and, Madam President, I think the body is familiar and would like to see Senator Chambers withdraw his amendments and I guess it's his turn to do that. Thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Kristensen. The Chair recognizes Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, Senator Lindsay (sic) made such an alluring offer that offer, that I would reach an agreement with him if I would withdraw my amendments in exchange for his withdrawing the bill. Senator Kristensen.
