SPEAKER WITHEM: A request has been made for a call of the house. All in favor of the house going under call vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 19 ayes, 1 nay to go under call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The house is under call. All unauthorized individuals leave the floor. All members return to the body and record your presence. A roll call vote has been requested. Senators Schellpeper and Haberman, your presence is requested. Senator Haberman is here. Looking for Senator Schellpeper. Everyone is here. Proceed with the roll call.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 607 of the Legislative Journal.) 17 ayes, 12 nays on the motion to advance LB 988.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The bill fails to advance. Mr. Clerk, next item. The call is raised.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next proposal for consideration is LR 29. LR 29 was discussed briefly yesterday. At that time, Senator Pirsch and others offered an amendment found on page 495 of the Legislative Journal. Senator Chambers had moved to amend that amendment. Senator Chambers, your amendment to Senator Pirsch's amendment is now pending. (See FA346 found on page 594 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Clerk, is that amendment printed? I am not sure that it is.

CLERK: It is 594, Senator. It was offered yesterday so it would be, 594.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, thank you. Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, the reason I asked if it was printed, I'd like the members to be able to see what the amendment is because you may not have been here during the discussion or you may have forgotten what it was we discussed. But in subsection (2) of the Pirsch amendment, and when I say the Pirsch amendment now, I don't mean the green copy, but the amendment that she offered to her green copy. I am moving to strike subsection (2) of that amendment. Subsection (2) deals with, Mr. Clerk, may I ask you another question?
