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desire to keep things I guess a little clearer as it related to the accounting function as required by both DAS and the auditor. I know that the language in the bill spells out that the investigatory fund, for example is not to exceed \$5,000, and these are minor things that in terms of keeping specific requirements as far as it relates to the operation, the oversight, and regulation of the lottery as clear as possible for bookkeeping measures, in addition to setting up the account for purposes of selling of the tangible personal property, those profits which would then flow into the trust fund for purposes of disbursement to both the Education Fund as well as the Environmental Fund. And I think that even though...I appreciate Senator Pirsch's questions, because when I originally saw it, I had many of those same questions about what are we doing here but, frankly, when we passed the original bill, we thought that those funds that we had established would be sufficient to handle this as it progressed and as the lottery has now been on-line for not quite a year but it has...these kinds of questions were raised by the Department of Administrative Services, and I think as Senator Schellpeper spelled out, they are clearly just procedural functions, accounting functions that are necessary to make sure the monies are accounted for, and that they are put in the proper accounts. That's all the amendment does and I, again, support Senator Schellpeper in his efforts to adopt this to the committee amendments and would urge you to do the same. Thank you, Mr. President.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Hall. Further discussion on the Schellpeper amendment to the amendment? Senator Schellpeper, you are recognized to close. Closing has been waived. The question is the adoption of the Schellpeper amendment to the committee amendments. All in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. If there are members in the Chamber who have not voted and care to, would appreciate it if you would. Senator Schellpeper.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: (Mike off) ...to do it again this morning but I guess I will, unless I get enough people to vote, I am going to have to call for...have a call of the house and call-in votes.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The question is, shall the house go under call? All in favor say aye or vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.
