

make it easier for somebody to possess a firearm, but that is not even touched by my amendment. It merely says that before the state can take property from a person, keep it and then destroy it, that person must be found to have violated a law which calls for the property to be handled in that fashion. If you have any questions about the amendment, I'm prepared to answer them.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. The Chair recognizes Senator Bernard-Stevens.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Thank you, Madam President, members of the body. Senator Chambers, I, personally, do not have any difficulty with the amendment, but I do have a question, and I'm just trying to refresh my memory. When the question was divided a few days ago, and we went through each one of the sections, I had at least in my green copy that we ended up striking Section 3, we did not agree with that section. And so I guess my question is now, are you amending that part which was not a...which was technically stricken, or is there a different place that needs to go?

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Bernard-Stevens, maybe I looked at what we were striking. I thought what we struck was Section 4, because, remember, that NRA amendment went to Section 4 which was existing language, and they were trying to make it lawful for a juvenile to possess handguns,...

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Right, and I thought...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...in Section 3.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: ...I thought the section, though, was pages 1 and 2, and then the first two lines of page...well, it would be the third page of the amendment that was there. And that's why I wanted to check on my memory to see exactly, make sure we're amending that which is still there. Maybe the question would be to the Chair, the division that we were on, on the amendment, last...I guess it would have been last week, did that technically then strike pages 3 and 4 and the first two lines of page 5 of the green copy?

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Let me check. Senator, all of the amendments
