SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you. I'd like to take the opportunity to make a number of announcements also. First of all, Senator Moore has asked the body to be aware that today is the birthday of one of our Pages, Peggy Sieck. Under one of the balconies, doesn't indicate which, is my personal shadow today from the University of Nebraska student group, Stephanie Weldon. Stephanie is from Axtell and she claims that her senator is Senator Doug Kristensen from Minden. We have a guest of Senator Cudaback, Brandon Powers from North Platte, who is shadowing Senator Cudaback today, and he is under the north balcony. I'd like to get your attention just one moment, if we could, to talk a little bit about priority bills status and what we have in mind. Number one, you need to be aware that personal priority bill and committee priority bill designation needs to be made by noon next Wednesday, February 23rd. Speaker priority will then be designated by noon on Friday, the 25th. A number of senators have talked to me about having bills designated as Speaker priorities and I really do not have a lot of preconceived ideas of what should be the Speaker priorities. I would request if you want me to consider a bill for Speaker priority status that you send a note to my office requesting that the bill be designated as a Speaker priority and a very brief rationale as to why it should. A number of people have been talking to me about those, and if I don't have some sort of written designation, it will be somewhat difficult for me to remember all of those. Short session, oftentimes, committee priority bills and Speaker priority bills do not get heard for time circumstances. I am working on a procedure whereby we might be able to consider some of the less controversial need to pass or at least need to be considered legislation on a...priority legislation on a consent basis. So I will probably be giving more favorable consideration toward naming Speaker priority bills that came out of committee without dissent, and also have some sort of urgency toward their being considered this session. If you have any questions about anything I just said, you know, feel free to direct those to me over the course of the next few days. With that, Mr. Clerk, Item 5, I understand we have a motion.
