

CLERK: Senator Wickersham voting yes. Senator Ashford voting yes. Senator Moore voting yes. Senator Vrtiska, you had voted yes. Senator Wehrbein voting yes. Senator Bernard-Stevens voting yes. Senator Avery voting yes. Senator Hillman voting yes. Senator Lynch voting yes. Senator Elmer voting yes. Senator Engel voting yes.

CLERK: Senator Crosby voting yes.
