

establishment of tax incidents of different...by economic sectors, when we met with the Department of Revenue for an update of how that study was going, one of the things that came out of that discussion was that for the purpose of that study that is an ongoing study, the information of the sales of real property that occurred could be important to be able to identify the seller, either by their employer ID number or social security, but...and so to still retain the confidentiality, instead of striking the requirement for those numbers, what the amendment that we will offer in place, and I apologize for not having it reproduced, is that it just simply would state that the local tax official would obscure that social security number or federal employer ID number when appraisers, licensed and certified or registered, would have access to the numbers, so we retain the confidentiality aspect of the number but still the information would continue to be available to the Department of Revenue when they are working with this tax incident study that is a couple, three years off from being included but it was essential. So with that rationale I'd urge that the committee amendment be rejected and then the other amendment that is filed be adopted.

SPEAKER WITHEM: You've heard the opening on the committee amendments. Any further discussion? Seeing none, the question...Senator Warner, do you have closing? Closing is waived. The question is the adoption of the committee amendments. All in favor vote aye, all opposed vote nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.
