SENATOR CROSBY: From somebody...somebody with a name like Moore? The question is the advancement of LB 991 to E & R initial. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. We're voting on the advancement of LB 991. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the advancement of 991.

SENATOR CROSBY: LB 991 advances. Mr. Clerk, do you have items for the record?

CLERK: I do, Madam President. Amendments to be printed to LB 884 by Senator Kristensen; Senator Lynch to LB 991; Senator Landis...I'm sorry, Senator Wickersham to LB 902; Senator Warner to LB 1290; Senator Landis to LB 446; Senator Chambers to LB 984. I have a reference report referring the claims bills. Two resolutions, LR 333 by Senator Hillman, Wickersham and Matzke. (Read brief summary.) And LR 334 by Senator Bernard-Stevens. (Read brief summary.) Thank you, Senator. (See pages 1116-22 of the Legislative Journal.)

Madam President, LB 1045, a bill originally introduced by Senator Warner. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 11, referred to the Appropriations Committee. The bill was advanced to General File. There are Appropriations Committee amendments pending.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Moore, on the committee amendments.

SENATOR MOORE: Yes, Madam President, the committee amendments become the bill. The bill, itself, introduced by Senator Warner would have appropriated \$5 million from the General Fund to the Job Training Fund for, I think, in Senator Warner's opinion, a one-time project. As I mentioned, in LB 991 we increased an appropriation to the Job Training Cash Fund by \$6 million, and in 1991, we had intent language on the three criteria that I've already mentioned on how that money can be spent for one-time type job training needs for a rather large scale project. All of that was in LB 991. What LB 1045 is is the transfer, is the companion measure to transfer the money out of the Cash Reserve Fund into the Job Training Cash Fund. That is all this bill does. It makes the transfer that was already alluded to in LB 991. That's what the committee amendment does. The
