SENATOR HALL: The house is under call. Those in favor...excuse me, will all members return to the floor. Please record your presence. All unauthorized personnel leave the floor. Senator Hudkins, would you accept call-in votes? Would, thank you very much. If we could have members return to the Chamber who are outside the Chamber, record their presence. We are voting on the advancement to E & R of LB 906. Senator Hudkins has allowed for call-in votes.

CLERK: Senator Withem voting yes. Senator Moore voting yes. Senator Lynch voting yes. Senator Coordsen voting yes. Senator Hartnett voting yes.

SENATOR HALL: Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays.

SENATOR HALL: The bill is advanced. LB 993, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have had a request from the introducer to pass the bill over.

SENATOR HALL: The bill will be passed over. Move down to LB 1000.

CLERK: Mr. President, 1000, introduced by Senator Bernard-Stevens. (Read title.) The bill was introduced in January, referred to Health, advanced to General File.

SENATOR HALL: No amendments? Senator Bernard-Stevens, to open on LB 1000.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Thank you, Senator Hall. Members of the body, I just want to make a brief comment on this bill. I believe very strongly in the bill, particularly on funding, on domestic violence in the State of Nebraska, we're woefully short on that. That part of the bill is not controversial. I do however believe that the funding source, which will be an increase in the fees for marriage license, might be controversy...controversial, and so consequently, personally, I don't think this is a bill that should stay on consent calendar, even though I appreciate the Speaker putting it on.
