

SENATOR CROSBY: In small counties and things that...yeah, okay. I just wanted it to be understood...I understood that. Yeah. Thank you.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Thank you, Senator Crosby. Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Question of Senator...Mr. President, members of the body, question of Senator Schimek, please.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Senator Schimek, would you respond?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: I'm sorry. Yes.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Am I to understand that this amendment or that what we're talking about is an elected official has to move to that county if he is elected, he or she?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: That would be the effect of this amendment, yes. And, Senator Haberman, if you would permit me, that's true with most elected officials.

SENATOR HABERMAN: I'm sorry, Senator Schimek, where I come from the county attorney is elected in other counties or appointed in other counties and he doesn't live there. Is this going to affect that?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: We...yeah, we have made an exception in statute for county attorneys.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Thank you.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Thank you, Senator Haberman. Anyone wishing to discuss further the Schimek amendment? Senator Vrtiska.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Just one question. Just one question, Senator Schimek.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Senator Schimek, would you respond?

SENATOR VRTISKA: You're talking about if they're elected, not if they're appointed?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, that is correct.
